## **Visual:** Library website home page

**Narration:** Harvard Business Review has restricted access to their articles offered in the EBSCO databases, worldwide. In some cases the full-text PDF of the article can be read, but not printed. In addition, we cannot link directly to the article in our course guides.

### Visual: course guide

**Narration:** So what does this mean for you? When you click a link for a Harvard Business Review article in our course guides, you may get a message, noting that full-text access is restricted. This will not happen with EVERY Harvard Business Review article, as we see here. But if you try to access an article that IS restricted from our guide, such as this article by Christensen, you will instead be taken to directions that show you how to search for the article, in order to get to the full-text PDF. We can do this by using the article's citation information. We'll search for the journal, and then track down the specific issue that holds the article we need.

### Visual: Library website

**Narration:** To find this Christensen article: 1.) go to the Search & Find tab, and click on Journals in the list.

### Visual: Journals search box

**Narration:** On the Journals page, type the name of the journal -- Harvard Business Review -- into the search box. Click "Go."

### Visual: Journal search results page

**Narration:** Harvard Business Review will appear on a separate results page. Click on the link for the database that holds the year that you need to access. For this Christensen article, we need the year 2006. Harvard Business Review is available from 1922 onward in Business Source Complete, so we'll choose that link.

### Visual: Journal page in database

**Narration:** Now you're on the journal's page within the database. You'll see a range of years available – look at your citation information for the article, and then click the year that your article was published in. For this article, we'll choose 2006. Then, click the volume and issue that you need. We need Volume 84, Issue 12.

### Visual: Issue page

**Narration:** This is a list of all of the articles found in this issue of the journal. Browse through the list, and find the article you need. Clicking the title will take you to the Citation page. Here, you will be able to access the full-text.
